Shizhaishan 石寨山, Lijiashan 李家山, Dapona 大波那, Wanjiaba 万家坝, Haimenkou 海门口, Qijia 齐家, Dong-son (in Vietnam), Lake Dian 滇池, Lake Er 洱海, Lancang (upper Mekong) River 澜沧江, Hengduan mountain chain 横断山脉, Eurasian steppe

#### **Artifacts**

kettledrum, cowrie vessel, socketed axe/adz, belt-buckle, shabrack-saddle cloth, alkaline-etched beads, openwork plaques, lacquer ware

## **Metal Techniques**

inlay, tin-plating, gilding, lost wax (*cire-perdue*) process, repouseé bivalve-mold casting method, piece-mold casting
