1. **Shringara** erotic rasa (blue/black—Visnu)

2. *Hasya* comic, humorous *rasa* (white—Siva)

3. *Karuna* sorrowful (pathos, compassionate) *rasa* (dove-colored—Yama)

4. **Raudra** wrathful, furious rasa (red—Rudra)

5. <u>Vira</u> heroic *rasa* (yellow—Indra)

6. **Bhayanaka** terrible rasa (black—Kali)

Mahakala, the terrible aspect of Avalokitesvara, Tibet, 15th C.

9. <u>Shanta quiescent rasa</u> (the color of jasmine and the moon—Narayana)
