Arai Kampō (1878-1945): Japanese painter who was a visiting instructor at Visva-Bharati University

Bharatmata (ca. 1905): nationalist painting by A. Tagore

Bengal Renaissance: multidisciplinary sociopolitical movement in India

Bichitra: Tagore home school in Bengal

Bose, Nandalal (1882-1966): artist and art educator

Hishida Shunsō (1874-1911): Japanese painter

Kala Bhavan: Institute of Fine Arts at Visva-Bharati University

Morotai (Hazy style): modern Japanese painting mode disparaged as "obscurantist"

Okakura Kakuzō (Tenshin, 1862-1913): Japanese art specialist, scholar, and museum curator

Rimpa: heterogeneous school of painting in Japan, Edo period (1603-1868)

Swadeshi Movement (1905-08): self-sufficiency movement that was part of Indian nationalism

Tagore, Rabindranath (1861-1941): writer, poet, Nobel Prize Winner for Literature in 1913, educator, artist

Tagore, Abanindranath (1871-1951): artist and art educator

Yokoyama Taikan (1868-1958), Japanese painter

Visva-Bharati University: university founded in 1921 by Rabindranath Tagore in Santiniketan, West Bengal

1905	Joined Government School of Art in Calcutta and became student of Vice
	Principal Abanindranath Tagore
1907	Received gold medal for Sati after its exhibition at the Indian Society of Oriental
	Art and the Industrial Exposition in Calcutta
1910	Graduated from the Government School of Art
1912-14	Spent 3 years with A. Tagore in Calcutta and became associated with Indian
	Society of Oriental Art
1915-17	Traveled in India with Arai Kampō of the Japanese Academy of Art

1919	Accepted R. Tagore's invitation to direct the art academy Kala Bhavan at Visva-
	Bharati University at Santiniketan
1924	Accompanied R. Tagore to Burma, China, Japan, and Malaysia
1935-38	Organized art and craft exhibitions for the Indian National Congress at Gandhi's

1947	India's Independence
1951	Retired from the Visva-Bharati University
1966	Died

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
