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The Ottoman Dynasty (1299-1923 CE) and its Capital Cities:

Dynasty founded 1299

Capital in Bursa, Turkey from 1326 TO 1402 CE Capital in Edirne, Turkey, from 1402 TO 1453 CE Capital in Istanbul, Turkey, from 1453 (conquest of Constantinople) to 1923 CE

In this presentation, we focus on the reigns of Sultan Süleyman I (r. 1520-1566 CE), his son Selim II (r. 1566-74 CE), grandson Murad III (1574-95 CE) and their 17th-century heirs.
