






THE GRAND PALACE IN BANGKOK

Constructed in 1782, the Grand Palace served as the official residence of the Thai monarchy for over 150 years and remains the ceremonial heart of the country. The complex showcases the pinnacle of traditional Thai architecture and craftsmanship, symbolizing the power and grandeur of the Thai kings. Within its walls lies Wat Phra Kaew (Temple of the Emerald Buddha), which plays a central role in Thai spiritual life and royal ceremonies.



BANGKOK

Thailand's bustling capital sits on the Chao Phraya River, serving as a crucial gateway between Southeast Asia's waterways and the Gulf of Thailand. It became the heart of Siam in the 18th century, flourishing as a royal and cultural hub under King Rama I, who moved the capital here after the fall of Ayutthaya.





Lumphini Park, Bangkok's largest most beautiful park is a 5-minute jog away from our hotel and provides a taste of the inner city's urban heart.

DAY 2: BANGKOK

Lecture with Cultural Expert Dr. Julian Brown: Set the stage for a deeper understanding of Bangkok's rich heritage with a presentation on Southeast Asian art & history.

Bangkok National Museum: Housed within the 18th-century Wang Na Palace, the Bangkok National Museum is Southeast Asia's largest and Thailand's first public museum. Founded in 1874 by King Chulalongkorn (Rama V) to preserve the royal collections of his father, King Mongkut (Rama IV), the museum presents an unparalleled journey through the nation's past. From centuries-old treasures and royal regalia to priceless artifacts from the Sukhothai and Ayutthaya periods, the museum offers a profound glimpse into Thailand's evolving identity and artistic legacy.

Lunch at Chakrabongse Palace: Nestled on the tranquil banks of the Chao Phraya River, Chakrabongse Villa is a hidden gem in the heart of old Bangkok. Built in 1908 by Prince Chakrabongse as a private retreat, the villa exudes timeless elegance and royal charm. Today, lovingly transformed by his granddaughter Narisa into a refined boutique hotel, the estate offers sweeping views of Wat Arun and a curated experience of Thai hospitality, culture, and cuisine. Enjoy a leisurely lunch amid this serene riverside setting.

Afternoon at leisure: Take the afternoon to relax or explore Bangkok at your own pace.

The Jim Thompson Beyond Silk: After the museum has closed to the public, SAA guests will enjoy exclusive access to the Jim Thompson House. This intimate evening experience offers a rare opportunity to explore the historic home and its extraordinary collection in complete tranquility. The journey into the world of Jim Thompson—an enigmatic figure who helped revive Thailand's silk industry—culminates in a stylish dinner and drinks at the estate's flagship restaurant and speakeasy bar. 

DAY 3: AYUTTHAYA

Lecture by Dr. Julian Brown

Private Coach Ride to Ayutthaya

Lunch at Sala Ayutthaya: Enjoy a refined riverside lunch at Sala Ayutthaya, whose restaurant blends contemporary design with spectacular views of the ancient ruins across the Chao Phraya River.

Ayutthaya River Cruise: Begin our exploration with a tranquil river cruise around the island city. Drift past atmospheric temple ruins, stilted river homes, and quiet stretches of countryside as you experience Ayutthaya from the water—a perspective that once defined life in this vibrant trading port.

Ayutthaya Historical Park: A UNESCO World Heritage Site, Ayutthaya Historical Park preserves the remnants of a once-magnificent capital city. Although much was destroyed during the Burmese invasion of 1767, many of the temples and royal structures remain as evocative ruins—some restored, others left in beautiful decay. Highlights include the iconic Buddha head entwined in the roots of a banyan tree at Wat Mahathat, and the elegant triple chedis of Wat Phra Si Sanphet, the former royal temple. These sacred spaces capture the city's former power and spiritual grandeur.

DAY 4: BANGKOK TO SUKHOTHAI

Curator's Visit to Dib Bangkok: Begin the day with a private, curator-led tour of Dib Bangkok, Thailand's first major museum dedicated to international contemporary art. We will be some of the first people to see this museum, set to open in December 2025, this transformative institution is housed in a repurposed 71,000-square-foot steel warehouse from the 1980s. The museum's name—Dib, meaning "raw" or "authentic state" in Thai—reflects its vision of unfiltered artistic exploration. The striking redesign is led by renowned architect Kulapat Yantrasast of WHY Architecture, the same team behind the ongoing renovations at the Louvre in Paris. Dib Bangkok's collection spans over 1,000 works by more than 200 artists, featuring painting, sculpture, photography, immersive installations, and cutting-edge new media from the 1990s onward. Its powerful debut exhibition, Invisible Presence, includes works by Montien Boonma, Lee Bul, Anselm Kiefer, and Alicja Kwade. At the heart of the museum is the private collection of the late Petch Osathanugrah, whose legacy lives on through this deeply personal cultural landmark.

Lunch at Leisure: Choose among Dib's several on-site dining options offering modern cuisine in line with the creative atmosphere.

Departure for Sukhothai: Transfer to Suvarnabhumi International Airport and check in for your domestic flight to Sukhothai.

DAY 5: SUKHOTHAI

Lecture with cultural expert Dr. Julian Brown

Sangkhalok Museum: This small but comprehensive museum offers a deep dive into Sukhothai's most famous product—its ceramics. The ground floor showcases an impressive array of original Thai pottery, unearthed locally, alongside pieces traded from Vietnam, Myanmar, and China. On the second floor, visitors can admire non-utilitarian pottery made purely as art, including rare and exquisite ceramic Buddha statues, highlighting the artistry and craftsmanship of ancient Sukhothai.

Lunch together in a local restaurant

Sukhothai Historical Park: Begin your journey in the central zone at Wat Mahathat, the park's crown jewel, where elegant stone carvings and towering Buddha statues capture the essence of classical Sukhothai artistry. From there, head north to Wat Si Chum, home to an immense seated Buddha tucked within a narrow, open-roofed chamber—a site that radiates quiet power and spiritual gravitas. As your exploration continues westward, a short hike up to Wat Saphan Hin rewards you with sweeping views of the park and the countryside beyond. Finally, venture to the southern zone to discover Wat Chetuphon, where grand standing Buddha figures create a tranquil, yet majestic, atmosphere.



DAY 6: SI SATCHANALAI

Lecture with cultural expert Dr. Julian Brown

Si Satchanalai Historical Park: No visit to Sukhothai is complete without exploring Si Satchanalai, once the second-most important city of the Sukhothai Kingdom. Now preserved as a UNESCO World Heritage Site, Si Satchanalai Historical Park offers a peaceful, less-traveled alternative to Sukhothai's main historical zone. Amid tranquil surroundings, visitors can discover 13th- and 14th-century ruins, including grand temples, towering stupas, and ancient city walls. Highlights include Wat Chang Lom, famed for its encircling elephant sculptures, and Wat Phra Si Rattana Mahathat, an expansive temple complex rich in architectural and historical detail.

Enjoy a light lunch at a local restaurant

Traditional Thai Cooking Class: On the way back from Si Satchanalai Historical Park, stop off for a traditional Thai cooking class, and enjoy a hands-on culinary experience in a peaceful garden setting. Learn to prepare traditional Thai dishes, using fresh ingredients from an organic garden and a local market, with step-by-step guidance before enjoying a lovely dinner of your own creation.



DAY 7: SUKHOTHAI TO CHIANG MAI

Private Coach Ride to Chiang Mai via Lampang City: Depart Sukhothai by private coach for Chiang Mai, with a stop in Lampang, a city steeped in the history of the Lanna Kingdom.

Lampang City Exploration and Lunch: Upon arrival, enjoy lunch at a local restaurant before delving into Lampang's fascinating past. Though often overshadowed by its northern neighbors, Lampang was once a vital stronghold of the Lanna Kingdom. The city remained under Burmese rule until the legendary marksman Nan Thipchang, a native of Lampang, assassinated the Burmese leader at Wat Phra That Lampang Luang—an act that ignited a successful uprising and helped reclaim Lanna independence. In the late 19th and early 20th centuries, Lampang flourished during the height of the teak trade and became home to Louis Leonowens, son of Anna Leonowens of *The King and I* fame. His historic teakwood residence remains a symbol of the city's colonial-era legacy.

Midday, enjoy a picnic lunch by the water, surrounded by the serene presence of elephants roaming nearby—a truly unforgettable experience.

Your local host will guide you through Chiang Mai's cultural landmarks and vibrant street scenes, culminating at the famous Night Bazaar. 

DAY 9: CHIANG MAI

A Natural Dye Demonstration & Lao-Tai Textiles: Step into the lush garden of Studio Naenna for an immersive introduction to Lao-Tai textiles. Begin with a live natural dye demonstration led by experts Patricia and Lamorna Cheesman, showcasing traditional techniques and regional botanicals still used by artisans today. Patricia then offers an insightful overview of Lao-Tai weaving traditions, exploring regional styles, symbolic motifs, and cultural significance. A leading expert in the field, she settled in Thailand in 1985 and has conducted four decades of research, published extensively, and currently teaches in the Thai Art Department at Chiang Mai University.

Conclude the visit with time to browse two galleries—one featuring finely crafted silk and cotton garments, the other showcasing rare interior textiles and antiques from Patricia's personal collection.

Visit the serene community of Baan Kang Wat: This small community of independent shops and businesses is made up of around ten unique houses, centered around a communal outdoor area and amphitheater to view a traditional Thai silk weaving demonstration. Lunch on your own at one of many cafes.

Lanna Folklife Centre & Wat Chedi Luang: Explore the Lanna Folklife Centre, housed in the former Provincial Court building dating to 1935. This creative museum offers an engaging look into traditional village life through life-size dioramas, highlighting lai-krahm pottery stenciling, *fon lep*—a mystical dance with long metal fingernails—and the rich symbolism found in Lanna-style monasteries. Afterward, enjoy a short walk to Wat Chedi Luang, one of Chiang Mai's most iconic temples, known for its towering ruins.

Farewell dinner: End your journey with a special farewell dinner in an elegant setting on the hotel lawn. Celebrate the trip's highlights with your fellow travelers and a final reflection on your magical adventure.

TRADITIONAL ARTS & CRAFTS

Benjarong Porcelain: Bangkok is particularly known for this traditional multi-colored enamel porcelain. The intricate designs and gilded details of Benjarong are often linked to the royal court, and artisans in Bangkok continue to produce these exquisite pieces.

Gold Leaf: Ayutthaya is known for its gold leaf, used in religious offerings and to decorate Buddha images in temples. Visitors can see artisans at work applying gold leaf to statues and religious objects in local workshops.

Sangkhalok Ceramics: Sukhothai is renowned for Sangkhalok pottery, a significant ancient export item. These ceramics are known for their durability and distinctive designs, often featuring fish and floral patterns. Artisans still create these traditional pieces today.

Wood Carving: Chiang Mai is one of the leading centers for wood carving, especially for producing intricate temple doors, furniture, and religious figures. The city is also known for its teak wood crafts.

Umbrella Making: The village of Bo Sang, near Chiang Mai, is famous for its hand-painted paper and bamboo umbrellas, which are a key part of the region's craft tradition.

Lacquerware: The region around Chiang Mai is known for its high-quality lacquerware, made using multiple layers of lacquer derived from the sap of a local tree, which is applied to wood, bamboo, or metal objects. These items are often decorated with intricate patterns, sometimes featuring gold leaf or mother-of-pearl inlays.

Textile Weaving: Chiang Mai is a hub for traditional textile weaving, particularly with northern Thai and hill tribe influences, producing beautifully embroidered fab Northern Thailand, particularly the region around Chiang Mai, is known for its high-quality lacquerware.






GASTRONOMIC DELIGHTS

Central and Northern Thai cuisines have distinct characteristics, shaped by geography and cultural influences. Central Thai cuisine is known for its balance of sweet, salty, sour, and spicy flavors, with rich use of coconut milk and aromatic herbs. Dishes like Kuay Teow Reua (Boat Noodles), popular in both Bangkok and Ayutthaya, feature a dark, flavorful broth and reflect the region's canal history. Massaman Curry, a mildly spiced dish influenced by Persian traders, is a favorite in Ayutthaya, showcasing the area's historical trade connections. Northern Thai cuisine is more herbforward, less sweet, and often focuses on

forward, less sweet, and often focuses on earthy, savory flavors. Khao Soi, a creamy coconut curry noodle soup with crispy noodles, is a signature of Chiang Mai, while Sukhothai Noodles, a lighter, tangy noodle dish with pork and peanuts, are unique to Sukhothai. Northern cuisine tends to use sticky rice as the staple, contrasting with the jasmine rice common in central Thai dishes.





WHAT TO EXPECT

We've handpicked walking routes that we feel everyone who is fit can enjoy. However, please note there is significant daily touring on foot, including time spent standing in museums while touring. Remember the streets of Thailand are often uneven and paved with cobblestones, and we may encounter stairs without railings or elevators, so you need to be surefooted. You can always opt out of an activity and take a coffee break or take a taxi at your own expense. While we hope that you love the itinerary we've created, we, of course, reserve the right to mix things up and swap activities if we feel it will enhance the trip.

IMPORTANT NOTES

To run this amazing trip as advertised, we need at minimum of 18 and a maximum of 20 attendees ages 16 and older. There are a maximum of 4 single occupancy rooms on this trip. After the first deposit, guests will be required to submit a signed standard Waiver and Release of Liability form for C&S and the Society for Asian Art.


POST-TRIP EXTENSION OPTIONS: DOI INTHANON NATIONAL PARK, CHIANG RAI, OR LUANG PRABANG


OPTIONAL POST-TRIP EXTENSION: DOI INTHANON NATIONAL PARK

Rising to Thailand's highest peak, Doi Inthanon National Park protects a rich tapestry of highland forests, clouded slopes, montane habitats, and waterfalls within a UNESCO-listed biosphere reserve. Recognized as one of Southeast Asia's premier birding sites, the park is home to over 380 species, including many rare and endemic to the region. Well-maintained trails and a temperate climate make it an accessible and rewarding destination for bird enthusiasts—just 90 minutes from Chiang Mai.










OPTIONAL POST-TRIP EXTENSION: CHIANG RAI
