



Scintillating Seattle September 24 - 27, 2024

Join the Society for Asian Art for a fun-filled tour to Seattle this fall! Seattle owes its place in the pantheon of Asian art destinations in the U.S. to Richard E. Fuller, a collector of Asian art who founded the **Seattle Art Museum** in 1933. Sixty-one years later, in 1994, that museum opened the **Seattle Asian Art Museum**, which houses a stunning collection of Chinese, Korean, Japanese, Indian, Himalayan, and Southeast Asian art. The museum continues to grow its collection of art centered around historic, modern, and contemporary Asian Pacific Islander as well as Southeast Asian art, specifically collecting different works created by local Asian Pacific Islander artists within the Seattle area. But dazzling collections in both museums are only part of the draw.

Other Tour Highlights

- Guided walking tour of **Pike Place Market**, including eight tastings from local purveyors
- Private tour of The Boathouse, the studio of internationally renowned glass artist Dale Chihuly, rarely opened and filled with his own private collection, where we will see glassblowers at work
- Visit to the home of a **major collector** with an outstanding Asian art collection
- Ferry ride to **Bainbridge Island** for a walking tour of the **Bloedel Reserve** gardens with the Director of Horticulture and her design team
- Stay at **Inn at the Market**, a classic four-star hotel hovering over Seattle's open-air public market, which is famous for its excellent restaurants and artisan stalls

September is one of the best times to visit Seattle, when temperatures average from the low 50s at night to the high 60s at mid-day, and rainfall is minimal, averaging only .28 inches for the month. We hope you will join us!

Itinerary in Brief

Tuesday, September 24th - Reception

- Arrive in **Seattle** no later than today by mid-day
- Check-in to the **Inn at the Market**, located on a cobblestone street inside Pike Place Market
- Guided tour of Pike Place Market including delicious tastings from eight Market purveyors
- Welcome reception and orientation at the hotel

Wednesday, September 25th - Breakfast

- Visit to **The Boathouse**, the studio and workshop of world-renowned **glass artist Dale Chihuly** (not open to the public), to see the artist's personal collection and glassblowers at work
- No-host lunch at Ivars Salmon House, next door to the Boathouse
- Docent-led tour of highlights at **Seattle Art Museum (SAM)**, which contains over 25,000 works of art from around the world
- Visit a **private collection**
- Dinner and the evening on your own

Thursday, September 26th - Breakfast, Lunch, Dinner

- Take the ferry from Seattle to **Bainbridge Island** (35 min.) for a tour of the **Bloedel Reserve** with the Director of Horticulture and her design team. This extraordinary 140-acre public garden and forest reserve features 23 distinct landscapes including a Japanese Garden, created under the influence of the conservation movement and Asian aesthetics.
- Bánh Mi sandwich box lunches from Ba Sa in the island village of Winslow
- Return to Seattle by ferry with free time this afternoon
- Farewell dinner at Café Campagne, a Pike Place brasserie well-regarded for its dedication to classic Parisian fare

Friday, September 27th - Breakfast

- Guided visit at the recently renovated **Seattle Asian Art Museum (SAAM)** in Volunteer Park focusing on highlights of historical and contemporary artworks from China, Korea, Japan, India, and Southeast Asia
- Lunch on your own
- Transfer on your own to SeaTac for your return flights home or extend your stay
