Historical periods:

Heian period 794–1185 Kamakura period 1185–1333 Muromachi period 1333–1573 Momoyama period 1573–1615 Edo period 1615–1867

Terms:

meisho: "famous places" or "named places"

meisho-e: "famous-place paintings" of Japan, a subset of the traditional manner of *Yamato-e* (Japanese painting), including Mount Yoshino and the Tatsuta River daimyō: warrior lords

daimyo: warrior iords

Seii tai shogun: the leading warrior lord, also known as the shogun

kiri crest of the Toyotomi family: a simplified paulownia plant with goshichi

Shugendō: a syncretic ascetic order

bvōbu: folding screens

shōji: fixed and sliding panels

kanjo (Skt., abhiseka): an esoteric ceremony

mandara (Japanese reading of mandala): a type of cosmic diagram

waka: thirty-one-syllable verse Tōkaidō: the Eastern Sea Road

Historical figures:

Toyotomi Hideyoshi (1536–1598), the leading warrior lord in late 16th-century Japan; his deified title was *Toyokuni daimyōjin*

Tokugawa Ieyasu (1543–1616), leading warrior lord in the early 17th century, named shogun in 1603, founded the Edo regime; his deified title was *Tōshō daigongen*

Kano Tan'yū (1602–1674), appointed official painter to the shogunate in 1617 Karasumaru Mitsuhiro (1579–1638), a member of the Kyoto imperial court, a

distinguished poet, and an innovative calligrapher

Isshi Monju (1608-46), a Zen monk

En no Gyōja (643-?), a holy man

Kōnin (?-778), a monk

Saigyō (1118-1190), a monk and poet
